# GUAM COMMUNITY COLLEGE Board of Trustees Monthly Meeting of February 15, 2008

#### Minutes

- V. REPORTS
  - President's Report:

### Financial Status of the College:

As of January 31, 2008, the college received about \$4.3 million, with a remaining balance of about \$2.8 million. Based on the current level of expenditures, President Okada said that GCC has actually received more money than it has actually spent. She noted that GCC has been meeting all of its reporting requirements with the latest being the submission of its FY2009 Budget, which is due today.

Additionally, President Okada reported that the college is currently working on the demolition of the T-buildings, the relocation of one of the T-buildings to be used as a temporary office during the construction of the new Science & Forensic Laboratory, the development of the Request for Proposal to have coral removed from GCC's property located on Route 15, the funding for the new Student Center by GCC's Foundation Board of Governors, the pending approval of the the grant document for the vocational education equipment from the Department of Interior, and the pending receipt of \$400,000 specifically for GCC's Apprenticeship program, which was approved by the House of Representatives through the efforts of Congresswoman Bordallo's office.

## 2. Monthly Activities Report: Student Trustee

Trustee Flores reported on the following:

- January 9, 2008: New Student Orientation was held with about 170 students in attendance.
- February 8, 2008: Community Partnership Mini Conference with GTA Teleguam with over 100 students in attendance.
- February 22, 2008: The Center for Student Involvement is coordinating an island tour for students
  who have been on island for less than two years. The tour will include visiting various historical
  island sites and places where students can obtain police clearance, their driver's license, etc.
- February 23, 2008: In partnership with the Guam Hotel & Restaurant Association, GCC's Career & Technical Education Job Fair to be held at the Micronesia Mall from 11am-2:30pm. All invited to come.

At this time, Mr. Mead requested the consideration of the Board to allow the Faculty & Staff advisory members to be included on the agenda for future board meetings to give a report on the activities of the faculty and staff.

### VI. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

## 1. New Science & Allied Health Building (Update)

President Okada noted that the RFP for the Science & Allied Health Building is currently being finalized, and that the funding of \$3 million for the project, through USDOI's budget, is still awaiting the approval of U.S. President Bush..

## 2. Board Assessment - Approval of Policy Review Tool

President Okada reiterated that the Policy Review Tool before the Board this evening was discussed during the initial policy review meeting held with Trustees Leon Guerrero & Ilao. Upon review and approval by the Board, the Policy Review Tool will be used by the College to evaluate existing policies for recommendation to either delete, change, update, or add. Attorney Hopkins recommended that for consistency purposes, the Board needs to determine which term they want to use on the document, "existing policy or current policy." Board members concurred to use the term "existing."

#### VII. NEW BUSINESS

### GCC's FY2009 Budget Request

President Okada at this time apprized the Board that GCC requested Senator Wonpat to have GPSS remove or withdraw from GPSS' budget any request for collateral equipment for GCC's use at the new Ukudo School. President Okada said that GCC does not want GPSS to identify what GCC needs and wants to prevent GPSS from having any involvement in the procurement of the required equipment for our programs.

Referring to GCC's FY2009 Budget Request, President Okada reported that the budget has gone through the Faculty Senate. She briefly went over the approximate additional increases to GCC's Budget.

With regard to the appraisal services, President Okada noted that it is in line with the insurance requirements, and that GCC has decreased its cost in the area of Capital Outlay from FY2008 to FY2009. Referring to accreditation, she happily shared that Dr. Somera was asked by ACCJC to host a Self-Study training on Guam with the participation of other colleges in the region. The training is being scheduled for March 2008.

President Okada stated that based on historical data of the college kept by the Governor's office, the Governors's budget request for GCC is \$13 million. She noted that GCC is not required to submit its budget request to the Governor for his approval because the Governor does not negotiate our budget. On the other hand, GCC's actual Budget Request for FY2009 is \$16 million. By February 15,2008, GCC is mandated by law to submit its budget request to the Speaker's Office. President Okada emphasized that GCC directly negotiates its budget with the Legislature. At this time, she requested the Board's consideration for approval.

In response to a question raised, President Okada clarified that from FY2007 to FY2008 it reflects an incorrect statement that the salaries and benefits went down. She stressed that this is not the case, but rather the costs for salaries and benefits for the vacant positions were sitting in the miscellaneous category. The necessary adjustments will be made to GCC's FY2008 Authorized Budget Appropriation template.
