Minutes

I. CALL TO ORDER

The monthly meeting of August 2, 2010 was called to order at 6:10p.m. Ms. Gina Y. Ramos, Board Chairperson, presided over the meeting held in the President's Conference Room located at the Student Services & Administration Building.

1. Roll Call

2. Recital of Mission Statement

Board members recited the Mission Statement: The mission of the Guam Community College is to be a leader in career and technical workforce development by providing the highest quality education and job training in Micronesia.

1. July 7, 2010 Meeting

IT WAS MOVED BY TRUSTEE FRANK P. ARRIOLA, SECONDED BY TRUSTEE DEBORAH C. BELANGER, THAT THE BOARD APPROVES THE MEETING MINUTES OF JULY 7, 2010, SUBJECT TO CORRECTIONS. MOTION CARRIES. (Voting: 6 ayes, 0 nays)

- IV. PUBLIC DISCUSSION None.

V. REPORTS

1. **President's Report:** President Okada reported on the following:

-<u>Financial Status</u>: As of August 2, 2010, the college has received \$10.374 million (63%) of its \$16.469 million budget for FY2010 -- GenFund (61%), LPN (73%), MDF (75%), and TAF (75%). This week's payroll will be met as the college's cash flow is still good.

-<u>Capital Improvement Projects (CIP)</u>:

- The classroom renovation project has been delayed, because the contractor did not complete the project as scheduled. However, the college granted and authorized an extension for its completion on August 4, 2010.
- Bathroom renovation on campus still on-going.
- The air condition unit at the Student Services & Administration Building (SSAB) is currently down, however the necessary parts have already been ordered. Also, the bid award was issued for the replacement & installation of the new air-condition unit for the SSAB.

-ARRA Projects:

- The Learning Resources Center's parking lot is scheduled to be laid tomorrow.
- The bid specification for the generator building is with our Facilities department for final review prior to putting it out to bid.
- The photovoltaic bid for the Allied Health Center will be issued this week.
- The photovoltaic for the Student Center will be through a change order as construction has not yet started.
- The layout for the renovation of the Foundation Building has been finalized. Because this project is funded through ARRA, the college only has a one-year timeline to complete this project, therefore, construction must begin by January 2011.

--The bid for the Redundant Network project has been cancelled, because it exceeded the budget. A different approach is currently being considered to include the possibility of reprogramming the money, which is funded under ARRA.

—<u>Update on Yigo land identified for GCC's Career & Technical Education (CTE) Center</u>: President Okada said that she met with representatives from the U.S. Department of Education on the subject property and noted that the land is already in its reversion process. Therefore, there will not be an attempt by the College to stop the reversion process primarily because the deed was given to the Guam Department of Education and at this point the U.S. DOE will not entertain any additional request for the use of that property.

After her meeting with U.S.DOE, President Okada indicated that there were two options that was agreed upon which include, 1) obtaining congressional approval to have all restrictions lifted for the property similar to how it was done for GCC's 314 acres of property, 2) after the reversion of the

property back to federal GSA, Congresswoman Bordallo will then put in a request for the property for GCC.

Additionally, with regard to the final Guam Environmental Impact Study Report and the request to survey GCC's property, President Okada noted that in speaking with Mr. John Jackson from Joint Guam Program Office (JGPO) regarding GCC's 314 acres of property and the Marbo property, Mr. Jackson indicated that GCC's property is not identified as a preferred alternative. Further, because of the water wells located on the Marbo property, Mr. Jackson noted that there is no intent to use that property as well.

—<u>Transfer of Forensic Labortatory from the Guam Police Department (GPD) to the Guam Community College (GCC):</u> President Okada noted that Speaker Wonpat requested the assistance of GCC to provide proposed language that will be included in a bill to solidify the transfer of the Forensic Laboratory from GPD to GCC.

-The GPD Police Academy is still on-going with the GFD Fire Academy to begin on Monday, August 9, 2010.

-ACCT Pacific Regional Equity Award: President Okada happily shared that the Association of Community College Trustees recently notified her that the Board of Trustees and the College has been selected as the the recipient of ACCT's 2010 Pacific Regional Equity Award. The award will be presented during the 2010 ACCT Leadership Congress in Toronto, Canada October 2010.

2. Monthly Activities Report

Student Trustee: Trustee Cruz reported on the following:

- COPSA's Plan of Action and budget for students has recently been finalized and approved.
- COPSA's last retreat is scheduled for this Friday, August 6, 2010.
- COPSA officers are scheduled to help with Express Registration August 10-14, 2010, will attend Fall 2010 Convocation on August 16, 2010, and will attend and participate in the New Student Orientation on August 17, 2010.

Faculty Advisory Member: Mr. Mead reported on the following:

- Department Chairs report back to duty today, August 2, 2010.
- Faculty Evaluation Committee is scheduled to meet on Wednesday, August 4, 2010 in hopes
 of finalizing the GFT-BOT Faculty Agreement, specifically the faculty evaluation of the
 Agreement.
- Happily shared that GCC's Culinary Arts program will be receiving documents from Le Cordon Bleu, Arizona, regarding the articulation of GCC's entire Culinary Arts program.
- As of today, enrollment has reached over 1,500 students for the Fall 2010 Semester.

Support Staff Advisory Member: Mr. Bautista reported on the following:

• Over the summer, several staff members attended various training offered by the Department

of Administration.

- New employee orientation is scheduled to be held August 13, 2010.
- Fall 2010 Convocation is scheduled to be held August 16, 2010.
- Extended congratulations and appreciation to the volunteers for a job well-done during Liberation 2010 Recycling effort.

3. Board of Trustees Community Outreach Report

-Several board members participated at the GCC/TakeCare 5K Fun Run/Walk event held July 24, 2010.

-On July 21, 2010, at the request of Ms. Janet King, Board Chair for Northern Marianas College (NMC), GCC Board Chair Gina Ramos, via a teleconference call with Ms. King and Ms. Lorraine Cabrera, NMC's Interim President, provided information on our Board's best practices relative to media relations and the presidential selection process.

-Trustee Ilao attended meetings regarding the upcoming Red Cross Golf Classic Tournament. The Red Ball is scheduled for September 18, 2010.

VI. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Construction Project Updates

<u>Student Center</u> - President Okada reported the recent passage of Public Law 30-157, which authorizes the Attorney General's Office to deputize other legal counsels to review procurement contracts in excess of \$500,000. She apprized the Board that she submitted a request to the Attorney General seeking his approval and consideration to deputize Attorneys Cabot & Mantanona as legal counsel to review GCC's Student Center contract, which has been at the Attorney General's office for two months already and is still pending their review.

Learning Resources Center - The LRC is still on schedule to be completed by the first week of November 2010. The Ribbon Cutting Ceremony is being planned between December 6 and December 24, 2010. About three to four representatives from the Washington, DC's USDA office, along with USDOI Assistant Secretary of Insular Affairs Mr. Tony Babauta are expected to be on island for the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

1. AGREEMENT between the Guam Federation of Teachers, Local 1581 AFT/AFL-CIO & the Board of Trustees, Guam Community College, for FACULTY (2010-2016)

President Okada noted that the concerns of legal counsel, upon his review of the Agreement, were presented to the Negotiating Team and have been incorporated into the Agreement. She explained in addition to the positioning of the Hearing Officer prior to presentation and submission to the Board

of Trustees because the Board is the reviewing authority, language on the definition of moral turpitude from the academic setting--step one, was incorporated.

At this time, Trustee Belanger, who represented the Board during negotiations, extended her appreciation to President Okada for asking her to participate in the negotiations, and also extended congratulations to the entire Negotiating Team for a job well done. She noted that her participation afforded her a better perspective on how GCC is run. The members of the negotiating team are good people, who all worked toward the best interest of our students and the college. She emphasized that the Faculty Agreement speaks and displays the caliber of the people who work at GCC.

Additionally, Trustee Belanger made a suggestion that the Board may need to develop a policy on the issue of Conflict Counsel.

Dr. Somera commented that the three weeks the negotiating team was sequestered was the most intense and difficult, but was a necessary process. It was a collaborative effort having perspective from all levels—the Board, the faculty, and the administration.

President Okada added that a lot of time and dedication were spent by members of the Negotiating Team in putting the Agreement together. She extended kudos to the committee and acknowledged that the Faculty Agreement negotiation process was done in record time.

Barry Mead said that he believes GCC is the only institution on island that uses the Interest Base Bargaining process in negotiating its Agreement.

President Okada suggested that for future board calendars that it be presented to the Board at its September meeting because the fiscal year budget normally gets approved in the month of August and the provisions in the budget law determines what the reporting requirements are. Members concurred.

4. Request to Amend Board Policy 228: Procurement Policy

President Okada requested the Board's consideration to approve amending Board Policy 228. At the request of President Okada, legal counsel reviewed the policy and incorporated the suggested recommendations to amend Policy 228. She explained that the policy before the Board this evening now stipulates that the procurement laws and regulations established in Guam's Procurement law, found in 5 G.C.A. Chapter 5, and 2 G.A.R. Division 4 shall be used by GCC in the procurement of all services, supplies, and construction procurement contracts.

- A very big Thank You to Trustee Belanger for her time & effort, and most especially for representing the Board of Trustees during the negotiations of the Faculty Agreement.
- Thank you to President Okada and her team, and to the faculty team.

PROCUREMENT POLICY

WHEREAS, Guam Community College (hereinafter GCC) is authorized to promulgate its own services, supplies, and construction procurement regulations pursuant to 5 G.C.A. § 5125, 5131, 5030(k) and (q), 5120, 5302(b) and (c), 5304(b), 5306(d), and 5307, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees wishes to prudently exercise the authority given to the college.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the procurement laws and regulations established in Guam's Procurement law, found in 5 G.C.A. Chapter 5, and 2 G.A.R. Division 4 shall be used by GCC in the procurement of all services, supplies, and construction procurement contracts. GCC hereby adopts the laws and regulations established in 5 G.C.A. Chapter 5 and 2 G.A.R. Division 4 as its own regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that GCC will employ its own Chief Procurement Officer, who will serve as the procurement officer for all supplies, services, and construction contracts for GCC.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that GCC may, upon the Board of Trustee's approval, delegate its procurement authority of construction contracts to the Department of Public Works.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that GCC may, upon the Board of Trustee's approval, delegate its procurement authority of services and supplies contracts to the General Services Agency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that GCC may, upon the Board of Trustee's approval, promulgate additional rules and regulations, in addition to those established by 5 G.C.A. Chapter 5, and 2 G.A.R. Division 4.
