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




SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID

14 students attending GCC received a total of **\$19,000** to pay for college through the generosity of private or government scholarship opportunities.

OUTLOOK



In response to the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on our economy, Guam Community College hosted the Workforce Opportunities Reimagined Conference (WORC) to identify areas of critical need in the post-COVID economy and to establish the training programs to help those unemployed or underemployed due to COVID gain the skills to fill critical jobs. As a result of the WORC conferences, GCC identified several areas of critical need and began offering Bootcamp training programs to get people retrained and back to work.





PV Production: 222.359 megawatt-hours

Recycling Data: Approximately 8,326 pounds diverted (recycled/reused)

WBFS Data: 7,070 x 12 oz plastic bottles saved

CO2 Reduced: 303,539 pounds

CAMPUS FACILITIES

Building 300's renovation project continues and is expected to complete in 2021, and will house GCC's new multipurpose auditorium.

The DNA Forensic Lab is expected to be completed in late 2021.

GCC acquired a satellite training facility in Barrigada that will offer construction trades courses with a focus on ship repair.

HIGHLIGHTS



In July 2020, Guam Community College commenced Guam's first paramedic training program, in partnership with the School of EMS, Tyler, Texas. Participants who successfully complete the 44-week program qualify to take the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic (NREMT-P) exam and become certified Paramedics. Paramedics. are trained and certified to perform advanced life support (ALS), which includes administering IV fluids, injections, medications and performing advanced respiratory procedures, which will save many more lives than we are able to save today.

CHALLENGES



Getting resources into the hands of our students remains the top priority for GCC. That's why students received CARES Act Emergency Cash Grants for College Impacted by Coronavirus Outbreak within days of its release from USDOE to GCC. Full-time students received \$440.00 while part-time students received \$220.00.

Retention and completion rates remain stagnant. New methods and plans will be developed to address this challenge.
